## MAYORAL MINUTES

### Community Safety on the T-Way

Councillors, the community has expressed growing concerns about dangerous e-bike behaviour on the T-way. Just yesterday, our fears have been realised with a collision between an e-bike rider and two pedestrian school students which has ended up with two people in hospital.

We need immediate action from the police to keep everyone safe and we need the Government to act now to ensure measures are put in place to restrict the use of e-bikes – including the implementation of mandatory noise alerts so pedestrians and other bike-users can hear an e-bike coming. Such alerts are now mandatory for new electric vehicles. Given e-bikes share pathways with pedestrians and other bike users, similar alerts should be mandatory for e-bikes.

I have seen and shared reports of e-bike riders travelling at high speeds, weaving between buses and emergency vehicles, using mobile phones while riding and treating the T-Way as a raceway rather than a controlled transport corridor.

Riding a bike can be a rite of passage for many young people and we don't want to take that away from them. However, e-bikes can reach high speeds and can have devastating consequences – and e-bike riders need to have the maturity and appropriate skill to ride them safely.

The T-way is legally for buses, emergency services and police vehicles only. Any unauthorised use puts bus drivers, passengers, emergency services, patients and pedestrians at risk, as well as the riders themselves.

This behaviour forces bus drivers and emergency services drivers to make split second decisions that could result in serious injury or even loss of life.

CCTV cameras are already in place on buses and along parts of the T-way, with unsafe and illegal behaviour being captured and available to authorities.

I have been told that residents have called police only to be told that there were not enough resources to attend. This is not acceptable. The residents of Fairfield and south-western Sydney deserve better. We need immediate action from the police to keep people safe.

Council will write to the NSW Minister for Police urging for swift and holistic action on this critical issue to ensure everyone's safety. Council will also write to the Premier calling for appropriate measures to be put in place to limit the use of e-bikes including mandatory noise alerts.

A number of locations within Fairfield Showground would be suitable and can be tailored to suit specific requirements – including the new indoor events centre (due for completion in 2028); undercover event awning for up to 10,000 people; the outdoor event arena for up to 10,000 people as well as the Showground Event Square.
